KEL'S CORNER

.At the meeting of the 19th November there were a number of unusual plants benched, also a nice display on each division.

On the Open Division bench T. & D. Vogler presented a beautifully manicured specimen of *Sarcochilus hartmannii* X *self*. The plant 55cm across with many racemes of pure white flowers. A really delightful plant.

We see very few Miltonias but a nice one was shown by K. & H. Gurney, not a big plant with 3 buds and 1 nice white flower having a brown mask and purple eye. The crossing was Hannover x Bleuara. The Gurneys also had an *Oncidium papilio* (now *Psychopsis papilio*). The plant had 3 long tall racemes 2 with 'butterfly' like flowers of orange colourations, the other raceme had lost the flower but was in the process of continuing with further growth and flower production. Owners may be tempted to cut off the flower spike but this must not be done as the flowering continues on the end portion where the last flower had developed.

Tony Bourne's *Cymbidium Cricket* (*Cym. devonianum* x *Cym. madidum*) was very nice, the 7 racemes pendulous and quite even, each having approximately 40 deep brown 2

1/2 cm flowers, the plant growing in a 20cm pot.

A. & I. Davies had an unusual plant on the First Division bench. The plant was growing in a 10cm pot with 13 racemes 15cm long, each carrying approximately 20 tiny brown flowers, each one about 4mm in size.

It was a *Stelis*: apparently quite a large group of pleurothallid species, found in Cuba, Mexico, Brazil and Peru. A plant without pseudobulbs it needs to be kept evenly moist at all times, it will make up into large clumps.

Rick. Pankoke benched two very nice plants, one a *Lycaste* {(Henty x Macama) x Sunset}. A specimen sized plant with 11 bulbs and carrying 12 flowers and 1 bud of good size being a deep pink well spotted around the petals and lip. The other plant was a soft cane *Dendrobium* Mem. Edith Wheeler. There were 5 canes in full bloom all over; the colouration was a pale pink into deeper pink, the 'eye' a nice deep brown. The pot size was 15cm with a bark type mix. Two quite outstanding plants and flowers.

Second Division was a little quieter number wise but of nice quality. K. Trevan's *Zga. Adelaide Meadows* 'Shirley' was growing in a 15cm pot with 2 racemes of 5 flowers on each, the green colour heavily barred brown

with the white lip heavily striped purple. (It was interesting to see the basket of flowering plants by our guest speaker Stephen Monkhouse).

Keith Sutton's *Bc. Binosa* x *C interglossa* was growing in a large pot. As the plant was also large unfortunately it only had 1 green flower 7 1/2 cm size, faintly spotted lip white with purple, normally this type of plant carries a good number of flowers.

Congratulations to all members who benched plants, these all help to make a lovely display.

August meeting Graham Hazledine gave us a talk on Paphiopedilums with the aid of slides which were excellent and well presented. Gave us a lot of information on how to grow this genera.

September a good attendance to hear Gordon Brooks talk on cymbidiums. The way he grows them, conditions such as fertilizing, watering, pests etc. A great night was had by all.

October, a little different, David Pettifor gave us an interesting talk on English Terestrials. Something very different and was enjoyed by all.

Rose fertiliser (good for other garden plants, too) for \$25. These fertilisers are significantly below retail prices, and even at these discounted rates, the Society receives a good percentage to help boost our finances, so give it some thought if you need fertilisers for your garden.

Peter has been kept busy delivering the bags, and I trust the sore knee he has developed recently is not a result of the work he has been doing on our behalf.
