. PRESIDENT"S ANNUAL REPORT 2019

Members I'm pleased to present my report for 2019.

We have had a very full and successful year, with three society shows, plus winning display and management of the canteen over three days at the SAROC Fair. Monthly meetings have been reasonably well attended, but we saw a noticeable drop over the cold winter months.

Committee have continued with their policy of topical orchid subjects where they could be arranged. We are presently compiling our guest speaker list for the coming year, but we seek your assistance in nominating speakers and subjects if you have any suggestions..

We held two pre— general meeting dinners during the year, catering ourselves for the August midyear dinner, and had a very satisfactory Christmas dinner meeting. Thank you to those who provided appropriate food items to round out our menus and also raffle prizes..

Our three shows for the year, were well received, but adverse weather conditions did not help us to provide as many plants in the displays and on sales tables as we would have liked. The Mid year show in the community hall at Klemzig successful financially and socially, and gave members the opportunity to mount their own individual displays of varying sizes . Your Committee is active ly considering taking the Klemzig Show to a later date and foregoing the early August show in a shopping centre. More will become clear as we pursue options.

Our annual SAROC Fair involvement last year .well was supported by our members, both with plants, and the skilful presentation by an elite and dedicated band of exhibitors. . Also your support in operating the kitchen in a very professional manner over the Friday afternoon to Sunday was most helpful to our convenors, Pauline and Garry Simcock. We were also grateful to volunteers from some of the other Clubs help provide to verv comprehensive supplies and competitive costs which helped achieve a successful financial result for SAROC.

Deane Johnston decided not to seek re-election as President for 2019. He has been an able advocate for our Society in many positions over many years, and his family involvement right from the inception of our Society saw it grow to be a very well respected organisation, with many members finding multi society involvement to their benefit in knowledge and the widened ability to show their orchids to the South Australian public He remains this year as Immediate Past president.

Deane has withdrawn from judging last year, and his expertise and knowledge of good orchids gained from years of interstate and overseas judging will leave a void which our judging panel will need to work hard to replace. Thank you, Deane.

Kevin Gurney, has withdrawn from Committee for family reasons for the present, and I would like to acknowledge his help with administration through the Committee, his knowledge as a previous judge, his expertise in helping provide trophies and his guidance as Show marshall and representative of our Society in liason with Shopping Centre management.

We lost Ian Attenborough last year, a dedicated judge and supportive and active member, and also Nan Grigg, whose involvement alongside her late partner and member, Colin Grigg, was appreciated by all who knew her well.

We have two new members on Committee, plus the return of Alan Davies. We wish them well in their endeavours for our Society, and I know you will give them support in the times to come.

The following two cattleya type blooms shown by the Gunns last meeting are an eyecatching reason you, too, should try some cattleyas.



I didn't write the names down, but consulting the results sheets, this 'Standard' shape bloom (rounded outline, with wide, well balanced segments) had eyecatching form and colour, so I guess it must be (C Tokyo Magic x RIc Mt. Isa)

This next one is a real eyecatcher with it's colour combination. It's classed as a `non – standard 'type as its segments are not as wide as others which are bred to have round type blooms, but isn't its colour combination outstanding

Cattleyas which flower from late Spring through the summer and autumn months are more easily handled than the winter flowering types, and should give you gratifying results with reasonable care and attention to water, humidity and fertiliser whilst in active growth.

There were numbers of the late blooming, small flowered cyms, too.



Note the colour contrast on the petals on this native *Cym canaliculatum*. There's lots of colour forms.

The vanda on the front cover is not the easiest type to bloom, but with the right conditions.they can grow to wonderful plants to show off your skills to other members. - the registrar's choice plant last month..



I just had to put in this species *Paph delenatii*, with its lovely clear white bloom on a dainty plant. Not the fastest growing group of plants, the `Chinese type of paph. species and hybrids are favourites of some of our best growers like Michael and Oui and me.

The species impart daintiness, clear colour and rounded segments which the

judges seem to love. The mottled foliage is an added bonus.



There are some lovely sarco. seedlings being flowered. Many are small on first blooming, but will grow bigger if the breeding is right. If you want big ones ask the seller what you may expect.

One of our commercial sarco. growers had a workshop recently (which we used to have a lot in days gone by), at which some of our members attended. I thought I had some photos., but I'll chase then up for later.

ALSO, I've been given an article about moving your orchids, but you'll all be spoilt if I put it in this month's edition. Anyway, it'll give me a start for next month, if I leave it till later

Sorry about the lack of colour last month. Everything should be back to normal this time. Hope to see lots of you at the Christmas Social evening, Come along at the usual time (about 8pm start) if you can't make it earlier for the Christmas dinner.
