REVISED SHOW SCHEDULES FOR OUR 2020 SPRING SHOW AT GILLES PLAINS SHOPPING CENTRE.

PLANTS LAST MEETING

"Plant numbers benched last month were generally subdued, but we did see some good quality plants tabled' Australian natives in both First & Second Div were impressive, and we saw some good cymbidiums on show, as we should expect as the season progresses. We are hoping for good support by exhibitors at the Spring Show at Gilles Plains later this month.

We don't see many masdevallias in Adelaide compared with the Vic. Country Challenge because we need special conditions to keep them arowing very cool. Their colours are spectacular, some even fluorescent

which always grows and blooms well. It has been around in Australian collections for many years. Bred in 1899, it features only 3 cool growing paphs in its genetic makeup, *Paphs villosum*, *hirsutissimum*, *and insigne*.

CATTLEYA CULTURE – BEYOND THE BASICS.

The following notes are based on information from Fred Stewart Orchids of USA. They are among the leading orchid companies in the USA, and their principal representative in Australia for many years was the famous late Frank Slattery of Sydney..

1 You may buy an outstanding selected variety, but if you do not grow it well, you can't expect to see it flowering to its full potential.. An average `good' variety, well flowered, will produce equally as good results as a top variety indifferently grown.

2 Your plants will flower best the longer they are undisturbed, provided the potting medium has not broken down. The `Orchiata' bark available here is very durable for catts. (and for cyms, too).. Don't be afraid to let them develop a growth or two over the edge of the pot. To avoid unduly disturbing the plant, one trick is to attach a half pot to the leading edge of your potful so the roots of the new growths can grow into new potting mix without disturbing the main plant.
