PLANTS LAST MEETING

Although the number of plants tabled were less in number than we have sometimes seen in the past the quality of plants was quite high,. Two of the cyms. shown have won top honours at the prestigious Sydney shows – Vanity Fair `Hollywood' has received an FCC, and Regal Flames `Queen of Hearts' has similarly recently been highly awarded..



Vanity Fair` Hollywood', a developing plant, can have up to 18 blooms per spike on a bigger plant.

This Regal Flames is regarded as one of Australia's top reds.

CATTLEYA CULTURE – BEYOND THE BASICS.

The following notes are based on information from Fred Stewart Orchids of USA. They are among the leading orchid companies in the USA, and their principal representative in Australia for many years was the famous late Frank Slattery of Sydney..

----More cattleya cultural tips.....
(continued from last month).

3. Cattleyas like light. It is the leaf temperature that does the damage, not the amount of sunlight. Poor light = poor growth and poor quality blooms. Make sure your plant house is good and bright – from 1500 to 3500 foot candles depending on the time of year and the air temperature of your house.

4. Your plants will bloom better the longer they remain undisturbed. If they are growing & flowering well & appear in good health, don't be anxious to repot.



Don't be afraid to let them develop one or even two growths over the pot edge. If a plant has grown over and is still in bloom, attach a half pot to the side of the pot so the leading growths over the edge can root into fresh mix. After flowering is complete, the front portion can be severed and potted up without unduly disturbing the plant.

5. If a plant needs repotting don't do it too soon before flowering. For example, a winter flowering variety should be potted in Spring so it's growth is in full swing .the autumn. Allow for 2-3 months of active growth and 2 or 3 months for development of buds to get best flowering results.
