. PRESIDENT"S ANNUAL REPORT for 2020

Presented at 2020 AGM held Jan 2021

Members I'm pleased to present my report for 2020.

Society activities during 2020 were severely disrupted by the arrival of the Covid19 virus, including impacts on monthly meetings, shows, Society dinners, visits and other outings. We were able, though, to fit in a Winter Show at Klemzig (previously named our Mid-Year Show) and a Spring Show at Gilles Plains Shopping Centre, a Display stand at the Adelaide West Fair, and for the first time, a Workshop and Sales day in November at our Adelaide West meeting hall which was quite successful. A proposed field visit to the Aldinga Scrub had to be abandoned, but we were able to organise a delightful day out to visit Roger Herraman's collection of Aust native Cym. canaliculatums in bloom, plus other plants, for which we were most grateful.

Prosthechea cochleata

This orchid should be in everyone's collection. It grows easily in a cym type mix, and it flowers from nearly every bulb it makes up. It is popularly called the cockleshell orchid (see the resemblance in the lips, which flower upside down.) No special growing conditions are needed. Some examples of this species have more blooms per

stem than others, and they don't always come out at the same time.

Keep an eye out for these chinese style paphiopedilums in the next few months. Miniature plants and slow growing, but beautiful.
