PLANTS AT LAST MEETING.

Memo to all First Division growers. Covid19 will not infect your orchids if you bring them along to meetings. We have been suffering from a dearth of plants on the First Div benches so far this year, and we would love you to bring some examples along. Judges suffering from withdrawal are symptoms through lack of practice. It should be a good flowering season this year with lots of cooler weather over summer – could do with some more rain .though, to freshen Hope to see more everything up. plants this month, even though it makes more work for me writing up

the results. We saw some fine Chinese paph species proudly displayed by Michael & Oui. The samples they brought probably grew from re-makes of the original jungle collected species using selected examples of the type (line breeding).

Let's look at Vicky & Neil Cooper's Valentine Day, one of autumn's most popular cattleya types. Besides having eyecatching blooms on multi-flowered stems, the plants grow and recover quickly from dividing. This one had nice, well displayed blooms on the raceme, and the plant was nicely in balance with the blooms and size of pot. It caught the members' eyes, too as it was the popular vote favourite in Open Div.



This 2nd Div plant `Unknown' looks remarkably like *C* Meadii to me, but with rather a deeper colour than many examples of that hybrid. Depth of colour differences are often a function of the amount of light the buds receive before opening- This can be found with other genera, like cymbidiums, too. Blooms of good substance too, shown by Dianne Bird.



Here we have *Stenoglottis woodii,* with compact flower stems and more decorative foliage than some other stenoglottis species. Shown by J & D

Higgs, this terrestrial would fit very gracefully into one of Jane's displays.



Vanda Rounsefell's *Ons* Tan Treasures `Lavender Picotee' perhaps deserves a more lyrical name for such a lovely, graceful orchid – best of Second Div, too.

NOBILE TYPE DEN's. CAN BE CRANKY.

The autumn comes, the nodules swell, They're buds, I'm sure. -- Are they --Hell! As each matures, upon my troth, More blasted adventitious growths.



Flowered normally, and quite well previously on the shorter canes. The tall new canes, expected to flower next Spring, developed nodules which grew, in the late spring and summer, into keikis. Now, I s'pose I'll have to keep them growing through winter, so no flowers next spring.!! But, I'll have a crop of nice , new keikis of a very nice *Den* Yukidaruma `The King'. (I hope). Am I growing it just too well??
