A dinner was held in the Drill Hall, on the Saturday evening, but sadly, was not supported to the extent that some previous dinners were. Those who did attend had a pleasant evening and meal in the company of other orchid enthusiasts together with

an informative address from our own Peter McCauley.

The standard of exhibits by the member clubs participating was very high this year, and some lovely specimen plants and other unusual orchids were on display. The commercial vendors worked valiantly to keep up the supply of flowering plants for the public to purchase, but it seemed to me that the numbers attending were down, no doubt due to concerns about the Covid 19 situation. The smaller Clubs worked hard to present good displays, and I particularly noticed the increasingly larger and informative efforts of the Native Orchid Club this year, and the very tasteful display from the Whyalla Club, which was staged by Alan Davies. The Cym Club, always disadvantaged because they specialise in cymbidiums and can't compete on the numbers of different genera parameter, nevertheless had some outstanding plants for this time of year.

Very shapely, brilliant colour, and I loved the spike presentation. This orchid is usually shown with spikes trained vertically.

The golden dancing lady orchid were all previously called Oncidiums, but the genus has been divided up by botanists to make some now Gomesas, and hybrids between this group and the one of the now reduced oncidiums genus nowgives us intergenerics named oncidesa. Fun, isn't it? Still nice, whatever it's named.

This is a Dracuvallia. a hybrid between the difficult to grow *Dracula* which needs high humidity and a *Masdevallia*, which must be grown very cool. The monkey face comes from the *Dracula* parent.
