SEEDLINGS OR CLONES AS PRIZES?

Sure, I have mentioned this topic in the past: there have been suggestions that all prizes should be seedlings, and after a recent visit. I thought I should review the situation. Some members have no preference. They are just happy to receive it and try to grow it on. Others would prefer the plant to be of a particular genus irrespective. would prefer a seedling so they could await its flowering. One member would like a seedling of a specific genus (cymbidium)0 so what happens when his expectation is not met? I have sold , on the trading Table plants (not cyms, which have been flowered to the same excellence as he flowers his cymsafter The same he has grown them on. member actually swap small non-cyms after prizes have been given out.
