There may have been intense competition in that particular class, resulting in the monthly points being spread around, and no one gaining the sufficient points required to win a prize..

. PRESIDENT'S (now Past President's) ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2021

Members I'm pleased to present my 2021 Report.

Continuing Covid 19 restrictions impacted on Society activities during 2021 principally the lock out of our Winter Show, but had impacts on attendance at monthly meetings, too, resulting in some not attending and limiting the numbers of plants tabled at the monthly meetings. Our 2020 AGM was deferred and our Christmas dinner meeting in December was cancelled. Dr Tony Bourne was elected as a Life member at that deferred2020 AGM.

We were able, to fit in a mid year dinner and a Spring Show at Gilles Plains Shopping Centre, and a Workshop and Sales day in October which was quite successful and supported by members with plants for sale, potting activities and considering the short lead —in time for advertising, quite a good public response. A field visit to Aldinga Scrub was a successful outing, though hungry kangaroos put paid to our aim of sighting lots of native orchids. P'raps next time

Our SA Regional Orchid Council was able to hold a SAROC Fair, although increased hire charges and public wariness of Covid infections had an impact on attendance and financial returns. Nevertheless, the Club interactions between growers raised our spirits and we hope for another SAROC Fair in 2022 Our Pauline Simcock was elected as President or the SA Regional Orchid Council in 2021, following in the

footsteps of others from our Society who have served previously (as well as again offering her services as our Secretary.)

Display plants at monthly meetings, and Spring Show were down, but the top growers showed us some lovely plants, both in size and quality, and Peter Haltis managed an AOC Cultural Certificate for a lovely Aust native orchid (see cover of November Review)

Thank you to our judging panel. Your guidance into what makes good orchids gives us all incentive to grow our own better, and to continually upgrade our collections.

Special thanks to Garry Simcock and Ralph Edwards, who, as Covid Marshalls, ensured we followed the Rules and kept us all safe at all our our activities. I am afraid that expected easing restrictions by the Government and leaking of infections from overseas and interstate will make it even more important to take precautions in the coming year.

It has not been an easy year for Committee, and I thank you all for your efforts to keep things working through times when circumstances changed to interrupt our regular routines. I have to stand down from the Presidency this coming year, and I know our new Committee will work assiduously towards furthering the success of our Society and cooperation of our membership. I note that me standing down means that Deane Johnston relinquishes the Past President position. The

Johnston family have supported our Society every year since its inception, and Stan and Deane contributed immensely to our success and progress over the years. Deane exhibited at the SAROC Fair again in 2021, and is the current AOC Delegate for the Regional Orchid Council.

Unfortunately, we lost two valued members this past year, firstly Mike Ferry in March, and then Les Burgess in July.

I thank you all for your assistance for the past 3 years, and I know you will give our new President, Mrs Diana Bird, and Committee the same support you offered me.
