# A TIP FOR KEEPING POT .PLANTS DAMP



"Study the photo. You will see that there's no weeds growing on the floor, the benching allows good air circulation, there's nowhere moulds and disease can gain a foothold, and there's lots of orchids, flowering plants thriving in this greenhouse .Can you guess who it belongs to.?"

"Recently I came across some water-well troughs. They are ideal for humidity-loving plants and take the place of individual gravel filled saucers. There were several sizes but the ones I bought measured 62cm long x 22cm wide. This size will take 4 pots of Phalaenopsis, Paphiopedilums or small Phragmipediums.

In these, you know that the pots are above the water and not

sitting in it and as the water in the base evaporates, it creates the humidity needed. Plus, they are much neater and more space saving than the saucers. I am really pleased with them.

They are available from Bunnings"

I can see another advantage ,too. With a few pots sitting in the water well trough, there's not the instability of single pots sitting on the bench., and less inclination for them to topple over. Also, if you find the need to shift them in a hurry, you don't need to shift the pots individually. Just check they are not wobbly in the water well, trough and you'll have less individual lifting to do.

#### PLANTS TABLED LAST MEETING

There were some well flowered plants tabled last month. Was this due to the cooler weather we had been experiencing?. This last month, with no natural rainfall to freshen up your plants might tell a different story in March.

Let's start with the lovely stanhopea on the front cover.. We're lucky to have seen it in such good condition. The big, waxy blooms you would expect to last at least a few weeks, collapse and shrivel after opening only a few days (and some in even shorter time)



Nothing wrong with the plant growth, either. We used to see them growing pretty tough, with sunburn on the leaves in an apparent effort to make them Most stanhopeas are highly bloom. perfumed, no doubt in an effort to attract a pollinator before the bloom fades. Another surprise is in store for the observant onlooker. Look closely and you will see that many flower spikes have grown vertically downward, and are protruding from the bottom of the potting basket. MAKE A MENTAL NOTE NOT TO PLANT IT IN A SOLID POT OR IMPENETRABLE POTTING MIX. Use paperbark, moss or something soft etc

A lovely orchid, two spikes open, 6 blooms each and a third with at least 5 buds. A well deserved Registrar's choice.



*Cym* Sundaani Autumn `Goldie' This bright gold specimen size cym had 14 spikes, but only 4 out last meeting. It always is the first of the season to bloom for Trevor & Margaret Jacob, bred by Pauline Hockey.

Diana Bird's *Ons* Catatante won Best Oncid., Popular Vote, and Best of Div. from a number of other growers in Second Div.



Ons Catatante `Petite Cherie Joe Cassar's Onc. Aker Baby has long sprays of maroon blooms, with contrasting white tips to the tepals and lips with a distinctive broad white frontal lobe. A regular winner in First Div. This cross is bred from *Onc* Sharry Baby.



Paph Helvetia

This non-standard slipper seedling was the only one tabled from Michael & Oui. Last month .It had 3 inflorescences, two with single blooms, the other with 2 buds on the one stem – a well grown plant.



Joe Cassar's *Epidendrum* Pacific Classic was just that, a big improvement over the hybrids which came before. Colour, shape and overall quality was very good.
