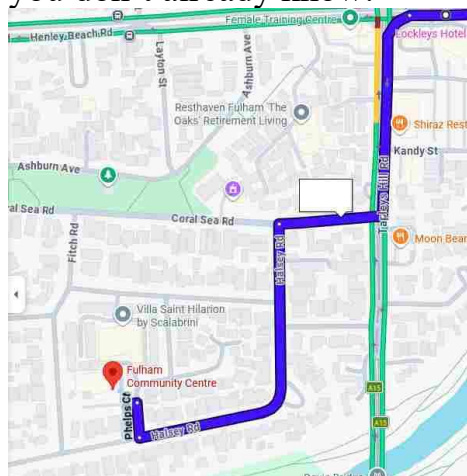

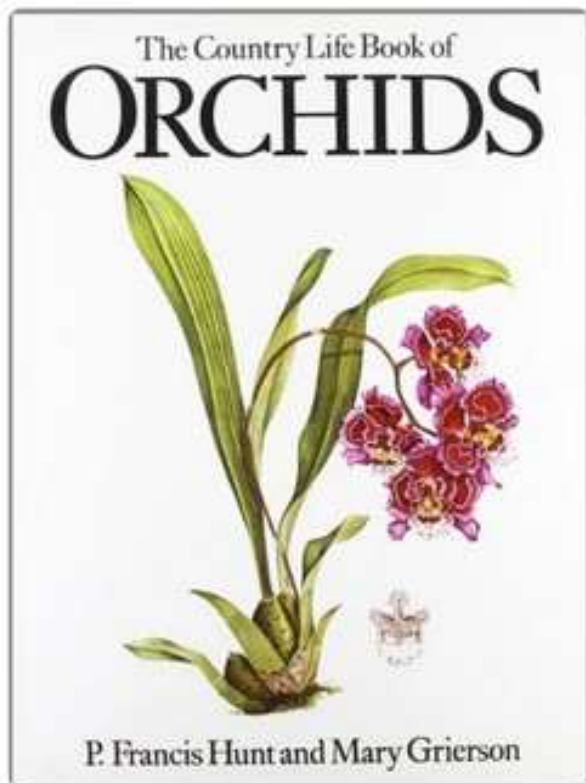

Jane's Showbench Chatter June 2026

Zygopetalum (Z.) maculatum.



This is a species in the zygopetalum genus and because it is a species it is written with a lower case letter at the start. It used to be called Z. mackaii. and it originates from Peru, Bolivia and Brazil. It is a very reliable plant to have as it flowers regularly on tall, straight stems. It usually has around 7 flowers which have green and purple petals and sepals with a white labellum, striped with purple. They are highly perfumed and the flowers can last for several months if protected from the weather. This was benched by Mario and Maria Vassallo.

Laelia (L.) anceps.



This orchid is also a species and a regular flowerer. It originates from Mexico and Guatemala and is temperature tolerant. There are several different forms of L. anceps which used to have different names, but are now all classed just under L, anceps. The stems are usually nice and straight but the flowers have a very sticky bract which will catch the flower and bend it over if not caught in time. The flowers are a very vibrant mauvy/pink with a purple lip and they have good substance. Benched by Carmel Edwards.

Jane's Showbench Chatter (contd)

Arpophyllum (Arpo.) giganteum subspecies alpinium.



Another species and this one comes from Central America. It is often referred to as the bottlebrush orchid or candlestick orchid. As the subspecies name suggests, it prefers cool conditions. It has dense, cylindrical spikes of small vibrant pink/purple flowers which are non-resupinate and held above the foliage. This is a dwarf version of Arpo. giganteum and not to be confused with Arpo. spicatum which flowers in spring. Benched by Michael Willoughby and Oui Ju.

Fredclarkara (Fdk.) After Dark 'Lachlan'



This orchid is in the Catasetum alliance and is a Castasetum crossed with a Mormodia. They have pendulous inflorescences and usually flower after the leaves have died back. The flowers have chocolate brown speckled petals and sepals with a brown labellum that has a cream band around the edge, spotted with brown. They have a very thick substance and are quite shiny in appearance. This was also benched by Michael Willoughby and Oui Ju.

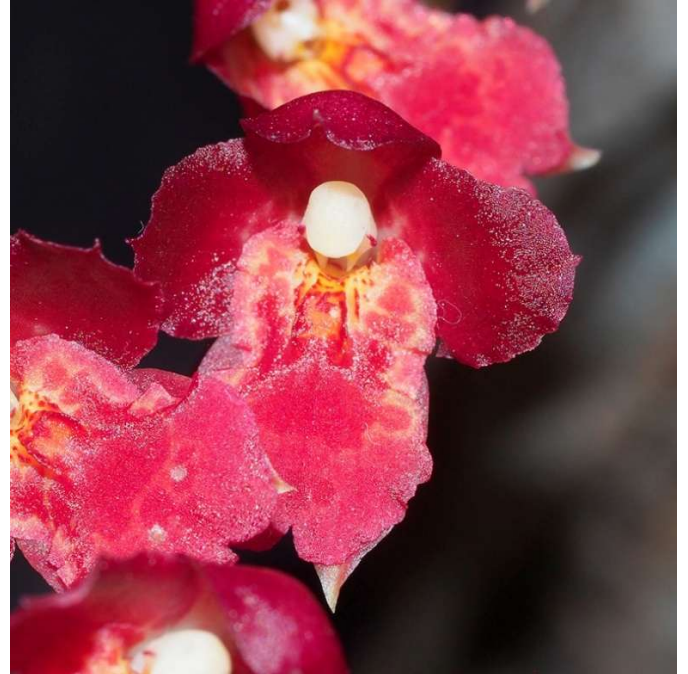


June Divisional Winners (contd)

Only a small plant with a single branched inflorescence carrying 9 small round maroon flowers and 10 buds. The white staminode contrasted nicely with the maroon tepals

Conditions for Exhibitors at Shows and Monthly Meetings

1. All members of the Society are eligible to exhibit.
2. The Society will take all reasonable care of exhibits, but shall not be responsible for any loss, destruction or damage of any plants.
3. The Show Marshall shall rearrange any plant or direct it to be exhibited as necessary to enhance contours of exhibits generally.
4. All exhibits shall be under the supervision of the Show Marshall and assistants, and any enquiries regarding exhibits or rules shall be directed to him/her.
5. The Committee reserves the right to reject any plant or exhibit.
6. The Committee reserves the right to remove or rearrange any exhibit.
7. Exhibitors must report to the Show Marshall on entry to the Show area for directions re exhibits and report again after exhibits are completed before leaving the show area. (For Winter and Spring)
8. Plants shall not be removed from the show before a direction from the Show Marshall.
9. Each plant or article used in the show shall have an exhibitor's number attached for identification and owner's security.
10. All plants are to be labeled with the appropriate colour label, and are to display the name of the plant and the exhibitor's number clearly in the places designated on the supplied label
11. No flower or fruit other than orchids may be used in any display.
12. All orchids exhibited shall be owned and grown by the exhibitors for the previous **SIX MONTHS**. If not, the plant shall be marked Not For Competition. (**NFC**)
13. Any plant exhibited shall be eligible for judging, except where marked NFC.
14. For Winter & Spring Shows all articles such as pots, boxes etc., used in floor exhibits and including all the visible floor area of the exhibit, to be covered with covering as directed by Committee, and to the satisfaction of the Show Marshall or his assistants.
15. Judging is to the A.O.C. Standards.
16. If, in the opinion of the judging panel, any exhibit or plant is not to the required standard, prizes may not be awarded.
17. Please note exhibiting times and dismantling times that are published, as these times are important for all concerned to assist the smooth coordination of all facets of the show.
18. **Staking of plants:** Cymbidiums are to have only one tie above the bottom flower for show purposes, although more ties may be used below the flower, within reason; Paphiopedilums and Cattleyas are to be tied and staked below the ovary.
19. At monthly meetings, members are requested to leave their plants on the benches for at least 10 minutes after the closure of the meeting.
